## ORDER

The hearing of this matter began before the Tribunal on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of September, A.D., 2016, adjourned to September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2016, October 13<sup>th</sup>, 2016

and finally to January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2017. After more than an hour of negotiating, the

Respondent made an offer to the Applicant to settle the matter for \$6,500.00. The

Court pointed out to the Applicant that she lacked the documentary evidence to

support her case that the Respondent owed her certain sums of money. She

produced a self generated paper purporting to show various sums she alleged were

owed to her. The Respondent had lost its records during hurricane Matthew and

did not have access to the one witness who would have been able to speak to it due

to the death of the witness.

The Court gave the Applicant further time to consider the offer made by the

Respondent. However, the Applicant stated to the Court that she would forego the

offer because she stands on truth. The Court therefore not being able to proceed

further dismissed the instant matter pursuant to Section 58(1), (d) of the Industrial

Relations Act. In light therefore of all the circumstances this matter HEREBY

STANDS DISMISSED.
