- 8) On the 16th January, 2023, the Tribunal served the Applicant's Representative and the Respondent's registered office, Seymour & Co., with a **Form J** (Notice of Hearing) dated the 16th January, 2023 and setting this matter down for hearing before the Industrial Tribunal, Freeport, Grand Bahama, The Bahamas, at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, the 3rd day of February, 2023;
