WHEREAS:

- 1) By Certificate of Referral dated 28^{th} May 2024, the Minister referred the subject dispute to the Industrial Tribunal; and

- d. The Applicant shall file her Witness Statements and Skeleton Arguments no later than 4:00 p.m. on 20th December 2024 and the Respondent shall file its Witness Statements and Skeleton Arguments no later than 4:00 p.m. on 17th January 2025 and, upon filing, the Applicant and the Respondent shall provide a hard copy of each to the Secretary to Court No. 5 and a copy of which shall be retained for the Court's use. Should the parties have their witnesses appear in person, a second hard copy of all documents to be relied upon at the hearing hereof, shall be presented to the secretary to Court No. 5.
- e. The witness statements shall stand as evidence in chief at the trial and should any witness not attend, the witness statements will not be accepted as evidence.
- f. The date of hearing of this matter shall be determined by the Registry.
