HEREAS:

- On the 25th September, 2020, **Tyeosha McKenzie** ("the Applicant") filed a **Report of a Trade Dispute** against **Bonanza Bar & Grill** ("the Respondent") at The Department of Labour in Grand Bahama, The Bahamas, which stated that <u>the issues relevant to the dispute</u> were *Severance pay, Back pay, Redundancy payment, National Insurance not paid up to date* and *Unemployment benefits*;
- By a Certificate of Referral dated the 23rd May, 2023 (received on the 8th September, 2023), the Honourable Minister of Labour & Immigration referred the said trade dispute to the Industrial Tribunal, Northern Region, ("the Tribunal");
- 3) On the 18th September, 2023, the Applicant filed a **Form A** (Originating Application), which stated, inter alia, that the grounds for her application were *Back pay, NIB Contributions* and *Severance pay*;
- 4) On the 21st September, 2023, the **Respondent** filed a **Form D** (Notice of Appearance) which stated, inter alia, that it intended to resist the application;
- The Respondent failed to file a Form E (Defence) within the 14 days limited for so doing by Rule 6 of The Industrial Relations (Tribunal Procedure) Rules, 2010 ("The Rules");
- The Tribunal conducted a Case Management hearing in this matter on Monday, 30th October, 2023, and made an Order On Directions;
- 7) At the hearing on the 1st November, 2023, pursuant to Section 59(1)(b)(ii) of The Industrial Relations Act and Rule 16(1) & (2) of The Rules and with no objections by the parties, the Tribunal joined Henry Glinton and Tory Glinton, Trading as Bonanza Bar & Grill as a party ("the Respondents") and dismissed Bonanza Bar & Grill from the proceedings;
- 8) The parties entered into settlement talks and the Tribunal adjourned the matter to 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, the 18th January, 2024, for trial;
- 9) The Tribunal subsequently re-listed the matter for trial at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, the 25th January, 2024;
- 10)The Applicant failed to appear at the hearing on Thursday, the 25th January, 2024;
- 11)The Respondents' Counsel appeared and the Tribunal adjourned the matter to 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, 22nd February, 2024, for trial;

- 12)The Tribunal subsequently re-listed the matter for trial at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, 9th May, 2024;
- 13)On the 26th February, 2024, the Tribunal served the Applicant and the Respondents' Counsel with a **Form J** (Notice of Hearing), dated the 20th February, 2024, returnable before the Tribunal at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, the 9th May, 2024; and
- 14) The Applicant, the 2 Respondents and the Respondent's Counsel failed to appear before the Tribunal at 10:00 a.m. on the trial date today (Thursday, 9th May, 2024);

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Applicant's **Form A** (Originating Application) be struck out for want of prosecution and this matter be dismissed pursuant to **Rule 12(1)(f)** of **The Rules**.
